



In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the March 4, 2026, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Council Approves Grant Funds for Marine Law Enforcement

Council approved Resolution 16-26, approving the West Coast Inland Navigation District Subgrant Funding Agreement with Lee County, Florida, to receive grant funds in an amount not to exceed \$350,000, for the Cape Coral Police Department's Marine Law Enforcement Program.

Council Awards Local Road Resurfacing Project Contract

Council approved Resolution 53-26, approving a contract with Pavement Maintenance LLC for the Fiscal Year 2026 Local Road Resurfacing Project, a critical infrastructure initiative that enhances safety and extends the service life of the roadway network. The Fiscal Year 2026 Local Road Resurfacing Project aims to improve approximately 72 lane miles of local roadways.

Council Awards Major Road Resurfacing Project Contract

Council approved Resolution 53-26, approving a contract with Ajax Paving Industries of Florida LLC for the Fiscal Year 2026 Major Road Resurfacing Project, a critical infrastructure initiative that enhances safety and extends the service life of the roadway network. The Fiscal Year 2026 Local Road Resurfacing Project aims to improve approximately 32 lane miles of major roadways.

Council Approves Agreement for Wireless Communication Tower

Council approved Resolution 59-26, approving an agreement with Diamond Towers V LLC to install and operate a 140-foot, wireless communication tower facility at the southeast corner of the City's North Cape Government Complex, North RO Site. The communications tower will sublease space on the tower to major wireless carriers, including Verizon, AT&T, T-Mobile, to improve and expand cellular service in the surrounding area.

Council Authorizes Additional Legal Authority to Address Code Violations

Council Approved Resolution 69-26, authorizing the City Attorney's Office to proceed forward to evaluate suspected, alleged or confirmed Code violations, when legally appropriate. This measure strengthens Cape Coral's legal authority to enforce its municipal code through lawsuits and injunctions, ensuring faster and more direct action against violators who endanger community standards or public welfare.
