



In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the June 3, 2026, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Council Moves Citizens' Input Period Earlier in Regular Meetings

Council approved a change to the timing of the Citizens' Input period during regular City Council meetings. Citizens' Input will now take place immediately after recognitions and achievements, rather than at the end of the meeting. This change will take effect at the next Regular City Council meeting on Wednesday, July 15, 2026, at 4 p.m. in Council Chambers.

Council Approves FY26 Spot Paving Program

Council approved Resolution 139-26, awarding a contract to Pavement Maintenance, LLC, for the Fiscal Year 2026 Spot Paving Program. The program includes work at various locations throughout Cape Coral, encompassing asphalt milling, resurfacing, and targeted structural repairs, as well as full-depth pavement reconstruction where necessary.

Council Approves Embers Parkway Access Management, Median Beautification

Council Approved Resolution 140-26, awarding a contract to VisualScape, Inc., for access management and median beautification along Embers Parkway between SW 15th Place and Pine Island Road. Work includes the installation of median curbing, underground irrigation infrastructure, and landscape enhancements.

Council Accepts Grant Funding for Sidewalk Design Along Skyline Boulevard

Council Approved Resolution 141-26, accepting the Florida Department of Transportation Safe Routes to School Grant Award in the amount of \$58,515. These funds will be used to design a five-foot-wide sidewalk on the east side of Skyline Boulevard, from Trafalgar Parkway to Pine Island Road, to enable safer pedestrian travel to and from nearby schools.

Council Accepts Forensic Science Improvement Grant Funding

Council Approved Resolution 148-26, accepting the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant Award in the amount of \$500,000. These funds will be used to hire two Latent Print Examiners for three years and to purchase office equipment.

Staff Provides Overview of House Bill 803

Development Services presented on Florida House Bill 803, effective July 1, 2026, regarding building permit requirements, exemptions, and fees. A communications plan is being developed to educate the public on the upcoming changes.

Council Approves Issuance of \$65M Special Obligation Revenue Bond

Council approved Ordinance 106-26, which supports Ordinance 27-26 and approves up to \$65 million in Special Obligation Revenue Bonds to fund major City capital improvement projects. The funding will cover work at Jaycee Park (\$18.7 million - repaid by General Fund), Coral Oaks irrigation upgrades (\$2.5 million - repaid by Golf Course Revenues), the North 1 West transportation project (\$14 million - repaid by 6 Cent Gas Tax), and Yacht Club seawall improvements (\$23 million - repaid by General Fund).
