



In case you missed it, the following are highlights from the August 5, 2026, Cape Coral City Council meeting.

Cape Coral is a proud Purple Heart City. City Council held a moment of silence in honor of Purple Heart Day on Friday, August 7, 2026.

Council Approves Replacement of Water Reclamation Storage Tanks

Council approved Resolution 166-26, allowing for the installation of two Poly Processing Chemical Storage Tanks at the Everest Water Reclamation Facility (WRF), which has a total of six tanks. One of the two tanks is out of service, and the remaining tank needs to be replaced. The WRF uses these tanks to store chemicals used to disinfect water prior to reuse distribution.

Council Approves Engineering for Replacement of Master Pump Station Generators

Council approved Resolution 183-26, allowing for the engineering and design for replacement of three master pump station generators that are over 50 years old and have reached the end of their service life. Master pump station generators provide backup power so wastewater keeps moving even when the electric grid goes down, preventing sewage backups, overflows, and environmental and public health hazards.

Council Accepts Grant Funding for Beach Maintenance

Council approved Resolution 202-26, accepting the Tourist Development Tax Grant funding in the amount of \$427,778 for the Beach Park Facility Maintenance Project at City parks. The locations that will be maintained with this funding include Sirenia Vista Park, the Yacht Club Beach, Crystal Lake Park, and Jaycee Park.
