



Pool (In-Ground)

Description

This guideline is used when constructing an in-ground pool on a residential property. With or without a spa

To apply, use the “Pool: Above Ground, In Ground, Spa, Renovation, Koi Pond, Fountain” application on the CSS portal. Select the “In Ground” option for type of work.

Who Can Apply

Pool Contractor (CPC), General Contractor (CGC), or Owner/Builder.

Required Documents – always required

- Site Plan
- Pool Layout
- Pool Engineering
- Manufacturer Specifications
- Hydraulic Flow Velocity Calculations Pump Curve
- Impervious Surface Calculation Worksheet
- Electrical Subcontractor Form
- Burrowing Owl Gopher Tortoise Affidavit

Conditional Documents – may be required, subject to the details of the parcel and the scope of work

- Notice of Commencement
- FEMA Packet and/or Elevation Certificate
- Eagle Management Affidavit
- Pool Subcontractor Form
- City of Cape Coral Hold Harmless Agreement (PUE)

Owner/Builder Documents

- Owner/Builder Affidavit



Private Provider Documents

- Notice to Building Official of Use of Private Provider
- Private Provider List of Building Inspections, if using plans review
- Private Provider Plan Compliance Affidavit, if using plans review

Review

- Building
- Zoning
- Planning, if applicable
- Environmental, if applicable
- Floodplain, if applicable

Inspections

- Notice of Commencement, if applicable
- Pool/Spa Steel and Bonding
- Pool/Spa Deck/Bond/Pressure
- Footer or Retaining Walls, if applicable
- Aluminum Structure for Pool or Fence for Pool
- Final Survey (Drainage)
- Pool/Spa Electric Final
- Debris, if using private provider
- Private Provider Compliance Report, if using private provider

Additional Notes

If utilizing a mastered plan, see the “Mastered Pool (In-Ground)” guideline.

The Impervious Surface Calculation Worksheet is not required in planned sub-divisions.
